College learning Trek

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Rouse Hill Anglican College has received a \$25,000 grant to establish a system to link parents, students, and teachers via computers in the school and home, in an effort to boost Maths and English results.

The Eduss Trek system is a "home-based interactive learning companion that uses the local school curriculum as a map to pin-point each child's progress".

Principal Peter Fowler said families should part with \$375 for the home version.

"The new Eduss Trek system is an excellent tool for consolidating what has been learnt in the classroom," Mr Fowler said.

"It can be adapted to individual student levels and provides constant feedback. Eduss Trek also allows students to take control of their own learning."
