Making maths easy

QUEENSLAND children are embarking on a revolutionary way of learning maths by adopting an interactive integrated learning system (ILS) developed by Eduss.

Children from five to 15 years are bridging the gap in learning difficulties associated with mathematics by using the Eduss ILS computer software product. The program tests and evaluates each child's learning capabilities through tailor-made

lessons that cover all areas of mathematics.
