KINGS Langley Public School has received a \$25,000 grant to equip students with a "take-home-teacher".

Principal Ian Roberts said the system, Eduss Trek, would help teachers, students and parents prepare for the 2004 school year.

"It helps our teachers by doing what they can't - give an individual child their complete and undivided attention for as long as is necessary," Mr Roberts said.

While nothing would ever replace teacher-student interac-

tion, Mr Roberts said the Eduss Trek home computer program was a solution to limited one-on-one time most students have with teachers in the classroom.

Students can download exercises from the school's master copy of the program and work through them at their own pace.

The system uses the local school curriculum as a map to pin-point each child's progress exactly. Day by day it helps each student to achieve high personal achievement and success.
